Adult Patrol Leader Campout Information



General: The adult patrol leader is responsible for bringing all food, supplies, and patrol gear needed for the adults on the campout.

Examples of Patrol Gear to Take (stored in the shack):

Stoves	Large insulated drink jug
Propane tanks/fittings	Water container
Dutch ovens	Plastic knives, forks, spoons*
Charcoal	Cups*
Charcoal chimney & metal pan	Plates*
Axe	Paper towels, napkins*
Bow saw	Dishwashing soap*
Rain fly/tarp	Pot holders*
Lanterns	Aluminum foil*
Cooking pots	Plastic wrap*
Griddles	Plastic garbage bags*
Cooking & serving utensils	Matches*
Rope	
U.S. flag	*
Troop first aid kit (red bag in shack)	Items kept in large blue patrol bin, may
Coffee pot or press	need to be supplement if supplies are low

Before Campout:

- Determine number of adults going (Lou will have a count)
- Plan menu
- Purchase groceries and supplies
- Determine equipment needs
- Check equipment out of shack from Quartermaster
- Large blue plastic bin labeled "DULTS" contains adult patrol supplies (see below)

During Campout:

- Take the lead in setting up patrol area, cooking, cleaning, etc.
- Ask other adults to help with tasks as needed
- Make sure that adult patrol area is clean before leaving
- Determine cost per person for groceries and ask for reimbursement. Non-food supplies (cups, plates, foil, etc.) will be reimbursed separately by troop treasurer

After Campout:

- Transport equipment back and make sure it is clean and dry
- Check equipment back into shack
- Store nonperishable leftover food (e.g., pancake and hot chocolate mix, coffee) to give to adult patrol leader on next campout
